I would like to take this opportune moment to welcome you at this stage of the tabling of my budget.

We are meeting here today on the last day of Africa month and also a workers month in this august house to present the Budget of our institution.

This year we are celebrating sixty years of the establisment of the Organisation of African Unity whuch was later renamed African Unity in 2002 following a decision taken in 1999 by its predecessor to create a new continental organization to build on its work.

The African Union was laucned to fight colonization and to unite the people of Africa in their diverse cultural traditions and customs.

Today we are proud to call ourselves Africans and we live side by side with our fellow African people.

We draw inspiration from the poem by the former president of the country Thabo Mbeki when he proudly wrote "I AM AN AFRICAN". in this poem therebare lot of teachings that we

should cascade down to our kids so that they are abkebto appreciate themselves and other African kids.

This year in April we have celebrated 29 years of freedom asbthebpeoplebof South Africa. This freedom that we are enjoying today sis not come cheap. It was achieved by the resilient and hard work of our forebearers during the struggle to fight Apartheid regime. This freedom thatwe fought for should address the triple challenges that are favingbour country today. Our people need better living, need water ,need food and they need everything that would change their lives foe better.

It is through this budget that we are adopting today that will wnwbke us to curb these triple challenges.

We need to ensure that from now henceforth we priorities our communities in terms of empowerment in general.

It is my privilege as Mayor of Ephraim Mogale Local Municipality to present 2023/2024 Budget. This Budget represents and informs the Integrated Development Plan and focuses on sustainability. The sustainability of a Municipality is a crucial driver of building community trust.

The Integrated Development Plan is the principal plan for the Municipality that provides a comprehensive agenda for progress and improvement. It aims to coordinate the work of local and other spheres of government in a coherent strategy to improve the quality of life for all the people of Ephraim Mogale Local Municipality.

The IDP must consider the existing conditions, challenges, and limited resources to set a framework within which Ephraim Mogale Local Municipality must function. It highlights the needs of all communities through public participation. It directs Council and the administrative operations to align available resources with these needs through the Budget by executing the Service Delivery and Budget Implementation Plan.

Budgets are always a balancing act and must also give impetus to our Constitution's obligations to local governments.

TARIFFS

Tariff-setting is a pivotal and strategic part of the compilation of any budget. When rates, tariffs and other charges are revised, we consider various factors, including local economic conditions and the affordability of services levelled against the financial sustainability of the Municipality. Still, we also recognise the need to accommodate the plight of the poor. After considering all inputs, proposed expenditures, and revenue, as well as prevalent conditions and challenges, the proposed tariff adjustments to fund the annual budget are as follows:

- Assessment Rates: 0%
- Electricity: 15.1%
- Cleansing: 5.3%
- Other income: 5.3%

OPERATING BUDGET

Madam Speaker, it is essential and praiseworthy to note that the budget presented to Council for 2023/2024 is both realistic and funded. I wish to emphasise that it is a remarkable achievement to continue delivering service levels without a budget deficit.

The annual budget provides total revenue as follows:

- **R414 million** for 2023/2024,
- **R424 million** for 2024/2025, and
- **R429 million** for the 2025/2026 financial year.

The revenue includes the MIG Grant for 2023/24 for **R39 million**, **R41 million** for 2024/25 and **R42 million** for 2025/26 financial year.

- Transfer and subsidies provided for in 2023/2024 financial year **R240 Million**. There is an increase of R19 Million compared to the 2022/23 financial year.
- Service charges has increased by **R6 Million** due to increase in service charges fee. However, it should be noted that there is also a revenue loss due to continuous load shedding.
- Property rates increased from R42 Million in 2022/2023 to **R50 Million** in 2023/2024 financial year. This is due to new valuation roll that will be implemented in 2023/2024. The property rates tariffs will not increase however the revenue will increase since due to new valuation roll.
- Interest has increase by R5,5 million in 2023/2024 financial year because of Municipality aiming to invest some of the monies not available for immediate use.

The total operating expenditure budget amounts to **R376 million** for 2023/2024, **R400 million** for 2024/2025, and **R415 million** for the 2025/2026 financial year.

- Salaries and allowances for municipal staff has increased by 5.4%. Remuneration of councillors are calculated on actual costs approved in accordance with the Government Gazette on the Remuneration of Public Office Bearers Act.
- Bulk purchases, Repairs and maintenance and Contracted services are causing a major increase in operational expenditure.

Capital Budget

Furthermore, we must ensure that the capital budget reflects consistent efforts to address the backlogs in basic services and the renewal and expansion of infrastructure and existing network services.

The key Capital allocations for the next financial year include the following:
